- Grief can occur after a death, divorce, illness, or other significant loss.
- Grief can affect your physical and mental health.
- The experience of grief is different for everyone.

Grief often involves intense sadness, feelings of shock and numbness or even denial and anger. For most, the intensity of the emotions surrounding grief ease over time. It's a journey that affects everyone differently. It can be physically exhausting. Mentally draining. Some find it difficult to do simple things, some jump into many projects and events to keep them busy.

If you or someone you know has persistent feelings of depression surrounding their grief. If your feelings are getting in the way of everyday life and you are unable to experience happiness, then you should seek outside help. It's okay to share the journey of your grief.
